## **1. ABOUT IGNTU**

The Indira Gandhi National Tribal University, Amarkantak has been established by an Act of the Parliament of India, the Indira Gandhi National Tribal University Act, 2007. The University started functioning from July 2008. The jurisdiction of the University extends to the whole country and it is fully funded by the Central Government through the University Grant Commission. The university caters to the tribals' long cherished dream of higher education.

### **1.1. Aims and Objectives**

The tribal people are rich in cultural heritage and skill of art and craft but they are still marginalized in respect to higher education as well as in other walks of life. Now in the present age of globalization the world has shrunk into a village as the society has advanced in technology. But the tribes, who are the custodians of Indian culture in real sense, are far behind in this race of advancement. In order to rescue them from the present plight, the university has put before itself the following aims and objectives:

- To provide avenues of education, especially higher education and research facilities primarily for the tribal population of India.
- To disseminate and advance knowledge by providing instructional and research facilities in tribal art, tradition, culture, language, medicinal systems, customs, forest based economic activities, flora, fauna and advancement in technologies relating to the natural resources of the tribal areas.
- To collaborate with national and international universities and organizations, especially for undertaking cultural studies and research on tribal communities.
- To formulate tribal centric development models, publish reports and monographs and to organize conferences and seminars on issues relating to tribes and to provide inputs to policy matters in different spheres.

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- To take appropriate measures for promoting the members of tribal communities capable of managing, administering and looking after their own needs by access to higher education through a university of their own.
- To disseminate and advance knowledge by providing instructional and research facilities in such other branches of learning as it may deem fit.
- To take appropriate measures for promoting innovations in teaching learning process in interdisciplinary studies and researches and to pay special attention to the improvement of social, educational and economic conditions and welfare of the scheduled tribes within the Union of India.
- In view of the aims and objectives of the university the major thrust will be on providing more opportunity for the tribes. However, the university is open to all.

**1.2. The Salient features of the academic system followed by the University are:**

### **3. BBA IN CULINARY ART PROGRAM**

## 5. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

### 5.1 QUALIFYING EXAMINATION:

A pass in 10+2 system of Senior Secondary examination or its equivalent from a recognised Board/Council with a minimum of 50% in case of General and OBC candidates and 45% in case of SC and ST candidates

Those appearing in 10+2 or equivalent examination can also appear in Entrance Examination 2018 on provisional basis. Provisional admission will stand cancelled if proof of having passed the qualifying examination (10+2 or its equivalent) scoring the required percentage of marks is not submitted at the time of admission or latest by **30.09.2018**

The offer of admission is subject to verification of original certificates/documents at the time of admission. If any candidate is found ineligible at a later date, even after admission to the Institute, his/her admission will stand cancelled.

### QUALIFYING EXAMINATIONS (10 + 2) LEVEL FOR INDIAN STUDENTS (with a minimum of 50% in case of General and OBC candidates and 45% in case of SC and ST candidates)

- Plus two level examination in the 10+2 pattern of Senior Secondary education of any recognized Central/State Board, such as Central Board of Secondary Education and Council for Indian School Certificate Examination or State Boards of Secondary Education.
- Intermediate or two-year Pre-University Examination conducted by a recognized Board/ University.
- General Certificate Education (GCE) Examination (London/Cambridge/Sri Lanka) at the Advanced (A) level.
- High School Certificate Examination of the Cambridge University.
- Any Public School/Board/University Examination in India or in a foreign country recognized by the Association of Indian Universities as equivalent to 10+2 pattern of Senior Secondary education.
- H.S.C. Vocational Examination approved by NCVT and SCVT of concerned state.
- Senior Secondary School Examination conducted by the National Open School with a minimum of five subjects, result of which should be available upto **30.09.2018**.

### 5.2 AGE LIMIT

For candidates from **General and OBC** categories, upper age limit is 22 years as on **01.08.2018**. Candidates born on or after **August 01, 1996** are eligible. In the case of **Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe** candidates, upper age limit is 27 years as on **01.08.2018**. That is SC/ST candidates born on or after **August 01, 1991** are eligible. Upper age limit for Physically Challenged candidates shall be reckoned as per the category he/she belongs to i.e. General/SC/ST/OBC. Date of birth as recorded in the Secondary Education Board/Pre-University Certificate shall be the authentic proof that will be accepted. At the time of counselling, this certificate must be produced in original as a proof of age, failing which the candidate will not be considered for counselling/admission.

### 5.3 PHYSICAL FITNESS

All qualified candidates will have to submit a physical fitness certificate at the time of admission from a Registered Medical Practitioner in the prescribed format given at **Annexure - 1**.

## 6 . RESERVATION OF SEATS

As per Government of India rules candidates belonging to certain categories are admitted to seats reserved for them. Benefit of reservation shall be given only to those classes/castes/tribes which are in the respective Central List published by the Government of India.

### 6.1 DOCUMENT REQUIRED IN SUPPORT OF CLAIM FOR RESERVATION UNDER SC, ST AND OBC CATEGORIES

The certificate of SC, ST & OBC category is required to be issued by District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate/Collector/Deputy Commissioner/Additional Deputy Commissioner/Deputy Collector/1<sup>st</sup> Class Stipendiary Magistrate/City Magistrate/Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/Presidency Magistrate/Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar/Sub-Divisional Officer of the area / Administrator/Secretary to Administrator/Development Officer (Lakshadweep Island) where the candidate and/or his/her family normally resides. Certificate issued by any other authority will not be accepted. Candidates are required to produce the original Cast Certificate along with attested copy at the time of Counselling as well as at the time of admission at the Institute.

### 6.2 PHYSICALLY DISABLED (PD)

5% of seats across the board are reserved for Physically Disabled candidates. For any category of disability (viz. loco motor, visual, dyslexia, speech, and /or hearing) benefit would be given to those who have at least 40% physical impairment, **subject to condition that the candidate is able to perform the kitchen practicals without any third person support.**

The percentage of disability of the candidates will be required to be certified by Chief Medical Officer (CMO), Central Govt./ State Govt./ Municipal Corporation run Hospitals only. Such candidates are required to produce the original Medical Certificate both at the time of Counselling and at the time of Admission to the Institute. In case of any dispute in determining the eligibility under PD category, the decision of the Medical Board to be constituted by Institute would be final. ### 6.3 LEGAL JURISDICTION

The Secretary of the ICI Society shall be the legal person in whose name the ICI may sue or may be sued.

If any person or officer dealing with the conduct of JEE engaged himself/herself in act(s) that would result in the leakage of the question paper(s) or attempt to use or help in the use of unfair means in this examination, he/she shall be liable to prosecution under the Indian Penal Code.

### 6.4 Important Information

- Admission to first year of BBA Culinary Art program is strictly based on the All India Rank (AIR) earned by the candidate in the written test of Entrance Examination and their choice of preference of the campus.
- Ranks are strictly based on the marks obtained by the candidate in written examination. No group discussion or interviews are involved.
- Admission is followed by checking of eligibility of candidates, verification of documents, depositing of first semester.

### 7.1 DATE OF WRITTEN EXAMINATION

### 7.5 Marking Scheme for (Entrance Examination) Written Test

Each correct answer under Numerical Ability & Analytical Aptitude, Reasoning & Logical Deduction, General Knowledge & Current Affairs and English Language components carry one mark. There is no negative mark.

### 7.6 Result of Written Test

Result of Written Test and allotment of seat for admission shall be announced on the ICI web site [www.ici.nic.in](http://www.ici.nic.in) on 10<sup>th</sup> July, 2018. However, the admission should be confirmed by physically present alongwith original document and by depositing one semester fee at any of the campus of ICI as under, between 10<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> July 2018.

## 8. GUIDELINES FOR FILLING UP THE APPLICATION FORM FOR ENTRANCE EXAMINATION-2018

- The candidates are advised to go through the Admission Brochure carefully and acquaint themselves with all requirements in respect to filling up of the Application Form for Entrance Examination- 2018.
- It will be the sole responsibility of the candidate to make sure that he/she is eligible and fulfils all the conditions prescribed for admission.
- If ineligibility of a candidate is detected at any stage before or after examination/declaration of result or during any stage of the programme, his/her candidature/admission will be cancelled without any notice, disciplinary action will be taken against him/her and entire fee will also be forfeited.
- The candidate must fill the application form in his/her own handwriting, clearly, legibly and in block letters.
- The Application Form should be filled in English only.
- Incomplete Application Form will be summarily rejected and no request will be entertained in this regard.
- Candidate should write his/her name in CAPITAL LETTERS (IN ENGLISH) as given in Class X or equivalent certificate. Write a single letter in a box. Do not leave any blank box within any word of your name. Leave only one blank box between consecutive words of your name. If your name has several initials, leave one blank after each of them.
- **Name of Mother/Father:** Write the name of your Mother or Father exactly as in your Class X or equivalent certificate. Leave one and only one blank box between consecutive words of your mother's / father's name.
- **Date of birth:** Enter the date, month and year of your birth as per English Calendar and as recorded in your School/Board (Class-X) Pre-University examination certificate. Use numerals 01 to 31 for Date, JAN to DEC(01 to 12) for Month and four digits for year of birth. For example, if born on **16<sup>th</sup> August, 1998**, the date should be entered as follows: **16.08.1998**.
- **Category:** Tick the appropriate box for your categories- General(GEN), Scheduled Caste(SC), Scheduled Tribe(ST), Other Backward Classes(OBC (Non Creamy Layer), and sub category such as **Physically Disabled(PD)**. Categories once declared by the candidate, cannot be changed at a later date (at the time of admission). **If no category is specified, you would be considered as falling under 'General' category only. And, no claim of being to a reserve category, whatsoever shall be entertained thereafter.** If a candidate falls in more than one category, he/she can tick more than one box, e.g., if a candidate falls in SC & Physically Disabled categories then he/she should tick the box for SC and PD Categories.
- **Gender:** Tick the appropriate box indicated for 'Male', 'Female' or Other.
- **Qualifying Exam:** Tick the box titled "Passed" if you have already passed the 10+2 or any other specified qualifying examination, which makes you eligible for the Entrance Test. Tick the box titled "APPEARING" if you are appearing for the examination, which makes you eligible. The title "APPEARING" covers the cases of "APPEARED in quifiling exam" candidates only.
- **Nationality:** If your nationality is Indian, write "INDIAN". If your nationality is not Indian; write 'Other' and write the nationality you have.
- **Mailing Address:** Write your name and complete mailing address IN CAPITAL LETTERS including the PIN CODE along with Telephone/ Mobile numbers with relevant STD Code at which the communication is to be sent.
- **E-Mail ID:** Write your one mail ID in which the written test call letter and the result can be posted.
- **Photograph of the candidate:** The candidate should affix his/her recent colour photograph with white background (without attestation) taken not more than three months old. The photograph should be pasted (NOT STAPLED) in the space marked for it.
- **Centre of Test:** Refer to the list of Centres of Entrance Examination 2018. Fill in the code and name of the Centre from where candidate wishes to appear for Joint Entrance Examination.

- **Verification and Countersignatures:** While filing up of the application form, the candidate must verify the correctness of all the particulars furnished by him/her by putting his/her signature at the appropriate spaces provided for the purpose in the application form. Signature is also required to be put within the box provided. The candidate must get his/her application form countersigned by the parent/guardian. Relationship of the person countersigning the application form with the candidate should also be specified in the box meant for the purpose. In case any candidate is found to have furnished false information or is found to have concealed any material information in his/her application, he/she will be debarred from admission. Further, such a candidate shall also be liable for punishment.
- **BE CAREFUL WHILE HANDLING OF APPLICATION FORM**
- No request for change/correction/modification in the particulars of Application Form will be entertained.

**Note:** Candidate may note in their own interest that there is no provision of relaxation in respect of age or qualification, so candidates may check their eligibility before submission of application form.

### **9.1 How, where and by when to send your completed Application Form**

Print out of on-line Application Form should be sent to "The Finance officer In-charge of ICI,C/o National Council for Hotel Management and Catering Technology, A-34, Sector 62, Noida-201309" by Registered Post / Speed Post. Applications mailed by Registered/Speed Post after last date shall not be accepted. Application can also be submitted by hand at NCHMCT, NOIDA. The last date for receipt of printed Application Form at NCHMCT, NOIDA is **16<sup>th</sup> June 2018**.

## **10 . ADMIT CARD**

**10.1 Admit Card** should be downloaded by all the eligible candidates from the site [www.ici.nic.in](http://www.ici.nic.in) or [www.thims.gov.in](http://www.thims.gov.in), from 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2018 onward. A consolidated centre wise list of the eligible list called for JEE written test will also be published in the ICI web-site [www.ici.nic.in](http://www.ici.nic.in) and NCHM's web-site [www.nchm.nic.in](http://www.nchm.nic.in) for information of the candidates. In case any of the candidate not able to download the admit card for any unwanted technical problem, they may come directly to the written test centre as per the consolidated statement displayed in ICI and NCHMCT' web-site. While comming they should bring one of his photograph identical to the photo he psted in the application form and any of his identity card viz. Voter ID Card, Adhar Card, Driving Lisence if any, Passport if any, PAN card if any in original to prove his/ her identity. Such candidates will be issued duplicate Admit Card by the centre supdt. and will be allowed to sit in the Entranceexam.

### **10.2 Impersonation**

Impersonation is a cognizable offence and Centre Test Administrator is authorized to file F.I.R. with the Police against the impersonator. Candidate should present the Admit Card to the invigilator at the Examination Centre for cross-verification. In case of doubtful identity, the candidate shall not be allowed to sit for the examination.

## **11. WRITTEN TEST CENTERS FOR ENTRANCE EXAMINATION-2018**

### **11.1 Date and Time of Written Test**

The All India Entrance Examination will be held on **01.07.2018 (Saturday)** from **10.00 a.m. to 12.00 noon**.

Candidates should report at examination venue 60 minutes before the commencement of the examination.

### 11.3 Change of Written Test Centre

Under exceptional circumstances, change of centre may be permitted if an application with valid reasons for the change of centre is received in the office of Finance Officer In-charge, ICI, C/o NCHMCT, NOIDA on or before **21.06.2018** along with non-refundable fees of Rs.1000/- through Demand Draft drawn in favour of **ICI**, payable at **Delhi/NOIDA**.

### 11.4 Code of conduct for candidates during Entrance Examination 2018

Candidates shall maintain perfect silence and attend to their Question Paper only. Any conversation or gesture or disturbance in the Examination Room/Hall shall be deemed as misbehaviour. If a candidate is found using unfair means or impersonating, his/her candidature shall be cancelled and he/she will be liable to be debarred for taking examination either permanently or for a specified period according to the nature of offence.

Candidates are not allowed to carry any textual material, Calculators, Docu Pen, Slide rules, Log Tables, Electronic Watches with facilities of calculator, printed or written material, bits of papers, mobile phone, pager or any other device, except the Admit Card inside the Examination Room/ Hall. If any candidate is in possession of any of the above item, his/her candidature will be treated as unfair means and his/her current examination will be cancelled and he/ she will also be debarred for future examination(s) and the equipment will be seized.

The candidate shall not remove any page(s) from the Test-Booklet and if he/she is found to have removed any page(s) from his/her Test Booklet, he/she will be presumed to have used unfair means and shall be liable for criminal action.

## 12. SEAT ALLOTMENT PROCESS

### 12.1 Allotment of seats

Allotment of seat will be made only on the basis of merit and choice filled by the candidate. Allotment of seat against the reserved category will be made out of the candidates exists in the merit list.

**12.2 Withdrawal and Refund policy :**




